International Dog Shows

Recently two of our club members attended the International all Breed Canine Association (IABCA) show. The main difference between IABCA and AKC shows is that the judges provide a written critique for each dog shown and gives them a rating number as to how the dog rates in comparison to the UCI breed standard.

According to both Mo Donnelly and Linda Wahlquist-Soos the shows are grueling. They are longer than normal because of the critique and there are two shows a day as well as the normal best in show competitions, bred bys and puppy classes.

According to Linda her dog "Maker" won 4 SG-1 certificates (the highest rating a puppy can get) which means that he now has both a National Jungsten Championat and an International Jungsten Championate - do not know if the title goes in front or behind his name - but he is now Abacus Rainmaker Jü.A

What is your favorite recipe?

Milk Bone Dog Biscuits

- 3/4 cup hot water
- 1/3 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup powdered milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg, beaten
- 3 cups whole wheat flour
- Variation: increase margarine to 1/2 cup and add 2 teaspoons sugar

In large bowl pour hot water over the margarine. Stir in powdered milk, salt, and egg. Add flour, 1/2 cup at a time. Knead for a few minutes to form stiff dough. Pat or roll to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut into bone shapes. Bake at 325 degrees for 50 minutes. Cool. They will dry out quite hard. Makes about 1 1/4 pounds of biscuits.

The Park entrance is on the right approximately 0.4 of a mile west of Roller Coaster Road
Just inside the park is a stop sign. Turn left to Pine Meadows.
Take the second left turn and drive up to the pavilions. The second one, # 4 is ours

Directions from the South:

I-25 Exit 156A Gleneagle Drive
After you exit, take the first right onto Northgate Blvd. This is a new four lane road.
Drive east approximately 3 miles and turn left onto Old Northgate Road.
Drive 1.3 miles east to the four-way stop at Roller Coaster Road. Turn left.
Drive north on Roller Coaster Road about 1.5 miles to Stella Road. Turn left.
The Park entrance is on the right approximately 0.4 of a mile west of Roller Coaster Road
Just inside the park is a stop sign. Turn left to Pine Meadows.
Take the second left turn and drive up to the pavilions. The second one, # 4 is ours
